PSSSA CO-ED PANDEMIC RULES

ANY PLAYER OR GUEST WHO REFUSES TO FOLLOW THESE RULES WILL BE EJECTED FROM THE COMPLEX FOR THE GOOD OF EVERYONE ELSE IN THE PARK. THE TEAM MANAGER/COACH WILL BE RESPONSIBLE FOR ENFORCING THESE RULES. IF THE TEAM MANAGER/COACH DOES NOT ENFORCE THE RULES THE GAME WILL BE CALLED AS A FORFEIT. REPEATED OFFENSES WILL BE CAUSE FOR THE TEAM OR PLAYER TO BE DROPPED FROM THE LEAGUE. BEING VACCINATED DOES NOT CHANGE THE RULES.

THE GAME:

- 1. Base coaches and umpires are required to wear a mask covering their nose and mouth.
- 2. It is encouraged that base runners, and infielders wear face coverings.
- 3. The on-deck batter or a player assigned by the offensive team will be responsible for picking up the bat, by the barrel, not the handle, after it is used.
- 4. The handle of any shared bat should be sterilized each time it is shared, including sterilizing the hands of each batter.
- 5. No gloves or other equipment should be shared.
- 6. Pitching screens should be carried off and onto the field by the pitcher.

DUGOUT:

- 1. Players will be required to wear face coverings in the dugout and maintain 6 feet of separation from other players.
- 2. Players are encouraged to be outside the dugout but not on the field of play because of the inherent danger of being hit by a foul ball.
- 3. When one team leaves the dugout, next team will need to wait until all players have exited, then enter.
- 4. The team leaving the dugout will police the dugout and get rid of trash, especially empty drinking containers.

CONTACT BEFORE, DURING AND AFTER GAMES AND PERSONAL HYGIENE:

- 1. **Spectators and Players** in the stands, the central part of the complex, or using the restrooms **MUST** wear face coverings and maintain social distancing of 6 feet.
- 2. **Before and between** games players must not congregate in the dugout and must sit or stand along the outfield fence with spectators.
- 3. **Managers** will be responsible for keeping any sick player or players in quarantine out of the facility.
- 4. **Most important:** Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth with unwashed hands. Wash your hands often, using soap and water for at least 20 seconds each time.
- 5. If soap and water are not available, use an alcohol-based hand sanitizer that contains at least 60% alcohol.
- 6. A "no-contact, no-handshake policy" will be observed. This includes all physical contact and extends to customary game-related activities, such as umpire-coach introduction, high-fiving or fist bumping, and post-game handshakes between members of opposing teams.
